- The Second season of the Under the Banyan Tree on a Full Moon Night will go beyond the traditional meaning of what is commonly recognized as 'Indian Music'. The second season of this series will be all about music that is contemporary and new in India today.

The series, which will run from August to November, will forefront music that is contemporary, evolving and connected with global musical influences, yet is Indian at its core. The August chapter of the series is a prelude to *The Sacred Pushkar*, a Festival of Mind, Body and Soul coming soon in October.

The evening will present Indian music in a perfect *baithak* style ambience for a community of music connoisseurs and artistes to come together and celebrate the magic of music. Audiences will also enjoy an interestingly conjured culinary experience complementing the evening.

The upcoming concert will present - *Women of the World* - an extraordinary vocal ensemble of 4 talented women - from different corners of the globe, who came together at the renowned

Berklee College of Music, Atul Shankar's Flute Ensemble from Benaras, as well as a solo set by Pavithra Chari, a Hindustani Vocalist.

The internationally acclaimed, award-winning ensemble, **Women of the World** comprises: Annette Philip (India), Ayumi Ueda (Japan), Giorgia Renosto (Italy), Debo Ray (Haiti/USA), and their guest drummer/percussionist, Patrick Simard (Canada). With a belief that learning about diverse cultures of the world through music is one of the most powerful ways to shrink distances amongst people, the group will serenade the audience with their musical sounds from across the world. Formed in 2008, *Women of the World* has evolved into a sisterhood, as much as it is a professional vocal ensemble. Having toured extensively in North America, Europe and Asia, *Women of the World* repertoire currently spans 32 languages and myriad musical genres. Their latest album, "LIVE" was deemed eligible for a Grammy nomination, and they were named the 2017 International *Acappella* Champions at the ACA Open festival, and most recently, the 2018 International *Jazz Acappella* Champions came their way at the Vokal Total festival in Austria.

This is the time of the year when Kajri (Kohl or black in Hindi), a semi-classical Hindustani folkish musical genre is sung during the Teej Festival. The dry parched earth is the longing maiden awaiting her lover, the monsoon clouds. Kajri woos the rainy season through its different expressions like Chaiti, Hori and Sawani, and can be heard even today in the Bhojpur regions of Bihar and Mirzapur, Mathura, Agra, Allahabad and Benaras in Uttar Pradesh.

The second artist of the evening, **Atul Shankar**, is an eminent flautist from the celebrated *Benaras Gharana*. He will share some nuanced rain-soaked music on his *shehnai* and flute. Atul Shankar received his training under his grandfathers, late Pt Bhola Nath Prasanna and late Pt Khelvan ji, renowned exponents of Benaras Gharana. Currently, he is training under his *dada guru* Pt Shyam Lalji for Shehnai and also training for vocals under his mother Smt Rita Shankar.

The third act of the evening is **Pavitra Chari** - A vocalist and composer from New Delhi. Pavitra began her training in Hindustani classical music under Satya Narayan Maharana and is currently a disciple of Shubha Mudgal. Pavithra is also one half of the acclaimed contemporary - classical duo *Shadow and Light* with Anindo Bose. For *Under the Banyan Tree on a Full Moon Night*, Pavithra Chari will present a selection of songs which will focus on the monsoon and festivals like Hariyali Teej that are celebrated during the rains.

Under the Banyan Tree on a Full Moon Night also comes with - an inspiring space creatively conceptualised by Anubhav Nath offering a stunning view of Qutab Minar, the venue 1AQ, the company of a select community and the rain- washed Full Moon to bring to you a complete musical soiree experience.
